



Feedstock Procurement Policy

Skeena Bioenergy prescribes the legality and sustainability requirements as defined by the Sustainable Biomass Program. These requirements include the verification of feedstock (i.e. fibre) origin and the confirmation of risk of it being controversial.

Within Skeena Bioenergy's supply base area, the following *may* be considered controversial:

- Feedstock from non-managed private land
- Feedstock from forests converted to non-forest uses
- Feedstock from caribou habitat
- Feedstock from designated old growth
- Feedstock from intact forest landscapes

Working with suppliers, Skeena Bioenergy adheres to the following practices **prior** to purchasing feedstock:

1. Identification of 'potential' controversial feedstock
2. Confirmation of controversial feedstock
3. Verification of appropriate risk mitigation measures

Skeena Bioenergy will **only purchase feedstock** that is verified to be in conformance with our legality and sustainability requirements.

Skeena Bioenergy reserves **the right to avoid/refuse purchasing** feedstock that cannot be confirmed to be in conformance with our legality and sustainability requirements.

Suppliers will be required to provide evidence of conformance and mitigation of risk prior to the procurement of feedstock.
